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## Caring for Children with ADHD: A Resource Toolkit for Clinicians

Over the last decade, the number of children diagnosed with attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD) has increased substantially. Primary care physicians often play a critical role in the identification and treatment of ADHD. However, according to a study completed by the CDC, the American Academy of Pediatrics treatment guidelines are not always followed, leading to nonoptimal outcomes and disparities in utilization of care.
