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Healthcare Response to Human Trafficking

Healthcare professionals (HCPs) have perhaps the most critical role to play in recognizing and responding to human trafficking in their communities. In the United States, up to 88% of human trafficking victims present themselves to healthcare settings, many between 15-18x, during the time of their exploitation. Survivors report on average more than 10 concurrent physical, sexual, and mental health issues. Their message to us is clear: both victims and survivors of human trafficking desperately need healthcare professionals to get equipped to identify, intervene, care for, and even prevent human trafficking in our communities.
